



The Prophetic Model: A Moral Foundation for **Modern Leadership**

Inspired by the timeless legacy of Prophet Muhammad , Superior University has anchored its character agenda in a model that speaks to all dimensions of human development. The Prophet's life offers an unparalleled example of leadership marked by humility, justice, service, and wisdom. His ability to transform individuals and societies was not built on authority alone but on ethical example. Under the visionary leadership of Prof. Dr. Chaudhry Abdul Rehman, the

Chairman Superior Group, this model was interpreted for contemporary higher education. Through years of study and strategic design, he introduced a framework that aligns with both Islamic ethics and modern leadership theory. This framework defines character not as an abstract ideal, but as a structured pathway of personal, relational, and societal transformation. Superior University's Character Mastery Framework is built around three concentric circles that represent the evolution of leadership from within, Each circle builds upon the last, forming a complete model of ethical leadership that aligns purpose with practice.

Twelve Core Virtues: The Language of Our Culture

These circles are brought to life through twelve core virtues that shape the university's moral vocabulary and graduate attributes. These virtues are not limited to courses or ceremonies. They are embedded in the daily language, actions, and aspirations of our community.

These virtues define what it means to be a Superior student and graduate. They form the ethical compass by which our decisions are made, relationships are shaped, and goals are pursued.

Institutionalisation of **Character Education**

Character education at Superior University is not a theoretical model. It is a cultural shift shaped through deliberate action across every academic and operational domain.

Academic Integration

Through the university's signature 3U1M Pedagogical Model, character is embedded from the first year to the final semester. Orientation sessions, Seerah-based Islamic Studies, values-integrated English courses, and postgraduate research on ethics and leadership ensure a consistent and developmental journey. The 1M year culminates in reflection and application, linking personal transformation with professional readiness.

Faculty Development

Over 750 faculty and staff were trained as character mentors. Top management participated in advanced training sessions, and expert trainers were certified to sustain internal capacity. Residential retreats in Kalam, Naran, and Türkiye fostered deep alignment and spiritual grounding.

Co-Curricular Engagement

Character themes were infused across student life. Student Voice Leaders became ambassadors of ethics in governance. Leadership camps, wellness



initiatives, and character-themed events encouraged students to reflect, apply, and lead through values. Governance and Policy

Our revitalized Graduate Attributes, policies of upholding honesty, integrity, responsibility, and fairness in governance have formalised our ethical standards. Recognition systems were introduced to celebrate character-driven leadership among faculty and students alike.

Students of Fashion Design work with S'Couture Fashion House, media students seek experience at BOOM FM and PAMA studio and business students apply their skills at incubated ventures within the Superior Group. Centres of Excellence including CMACED, ANCRD, Innovation District 92 ScaleUp Pk, CAKCCIS, SpeakSure, and Agrivet Research Park provide interdisciplinary innovation, research, and character education while the 3U1M pedagogical model ensures values-based education throughout every academic cycle.




Expanding Access: A University for All

Superior University actively promotes higher education access to underserved regions of Pakistan. While Lahore remains our demographic centre, significant outreach includes students from Gujranwala, Faisalabad, Multan, KP, and Baluchistan. Currently, 86% of our students come from Lahore, with strategic inclusion from surrounding regions and a growing pool of international learners from Palestine, Yemen, Sudan, Somalia, and the UK.

Advancing Gender Equity in Enrolment

With 43% female enrolment, Superior is making steady progress towards gender parity. Campuses in Rahim Yar Khan (62%) and Sargodha (50%) already report female-majority enrolments. While campuses such as Gold and Law Campus still reflect a gender gap, targeted inclusion policies and financial access programs are closing the divide.

Financial Accessibility: Improving Educational Access through **Financial Assistance and Scholarships**

PKR 2.4 billion Disbursed in Scholarships

Superior is committed to dismantling financial barriers to education. In 2025 alone, PKR 2.46 billion were awarded in scholarships, 43% of which benefited female students. The scholarship framework includes need-based, merit-based, sports. alumni, kinship, and special categories. These scholarships not only enable access but reflect our alignment with SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), and SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities).

Expanding Access: Global Trust and Regional Relevance

With 99.57% of students from within Pakistan and 0.43% from international regions. our demographic footprint shows both deep local roots and emerging global trust. As Superior expands into new geographies including the UAE through RAKEZ and deepens its cross-continental partnerships, we are fulfilling our ambition to become a globally connected, locally impactful institution.















Empowering Superheroes for building Sustainable Societies

job oriented thinking into an entrepreneurial mindset, while the Social Entrepreneurship Program fosters socially responsible innovation aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Finally, we explain how our robust Quality Assurance Framework ensures excellence at every step of the teaching and learning journey, reinforcing Superior's commitment to impactful, future-ready education.



Our Experiential Learning Framework to Ensure Employability

The 3U1M Framework offers a transformative four-year academic journey, integrating three years of intensive project-based learning and skill development, followed by a final year focused on personalized, market-driven career pathways. The journey begins with the Freshman Program, which imparts lifelong learning skills among students and prepare them to gain maximum learning and exposure during their degree program.

In the first three years, students engage in hands-on, project-based learning, applying theoretical knowledge to real-world challenges. Their experience is further enriched through flagship initiatives such as the Entrepreneurship Teaching and Training Program, Social Entrepreneurship Program, Mentorship Program, Outcome-Based Education, and the Semester Exchange Program, offering immersive learning and global exposure.

In this year, students explore academic options aligned with their interests and learning styles. With increased autonomy and flexible learning pathways, they gain clarity of purpose, shape their professional identity, and continue developing cognitively and personally through meaningful skill-building experiences.

A hallmark feature of Project Based Learning is our **Comprehensive Instructional Design**

At the end of each year students undertake a Capstone Project which is aligned horizontally, with courses being taught in that semesters and vertically, with courses taught in the previous semester(s). This enables students to apply their theoretical knowledge into real life situation and projects.

Integration with Program Learning Objective and Outcomes

Each PBL is tailored to the specific program to build key skills and graduate attributes. Progress is tracked through PLO-based evaluations, monthly skill tracking, and final analysis reports.




Superior Entrepreneurship Education Model (SEEM), focuses on cultivating an entrepreneurial mindset and skillset essential for launching new ventures and driving innovation within established companies, ultimately creating social and economic impact. This practice-based approach develops entrepreneurial leaders through six core components of SEEM.



ETTP has been developed and implemented by The Chaudhary Muhammad Akram Center for Entrepreneurship and Development (CMACED). It is university's flagship hub for cultivating entrepreneurial mindsets. It empowers students to become job creators by supporting early-stage business ideas with mentorship, networks, and facilities.

Innovative Classroom model

Our innovative classroom model for the entrepreneurship course is a collaborative effort between a certified instructor and trained coaches. The instructor delivers lectures and provides guidance, while the coaches work closely with students to help them bring their business ideas to life. Students are divided into groups of five, where they develop and refine their startup concepts.





The ETTP team creates the entrepreneurship curriculum in consultation with all faculties and departments.

Innovative Curriculum Development & Pedagogies

Our curriculum and pedagogies ensure that every graduate will possess the necessary entrepreneurial skills and knowledge, and entrepreneurship training in developing entrepreneurial attitudes and behaviors.

Coach Capacity Building Program

At the core of ETTP lies the Coach Capacity Building Program (CCBP), a comprehensive training program for faculty members. Through CCBP, faculty members receive cutting-edge training on "teaching entrepreneurship," equip themselves with the knowledge and skills to incorporate entrepreneurship theory and practice into their courses effectively.

Research. This initiative marks a significant evolution in institutional planning, signaling a transition from reactive policies to forward-looking governance structures. It highlights Superior University's commitment to ethical leadership, continuous improvement, and participatory engagement.

Developed under the Soar to Roar Strategic Plan (2023–28) and deeply rooted in the Character Mastery Project, the Governance Index exemplifies the University's core values: responsibility, integrity, transparency, and service leadership. It embodies a new paradigm of institutional excellence.
