







Our students act as the ambassadors of Pakistan abroad. Superior International Office is having partners in over 15 countries. The International Office sends students and faculty for training programs, cultural exchange programs, research programs and academic exchange programs. The sole aim of the office is to expand the horizons of Superior's superheroes by providing them the best opportunities and adequate exposure. The team is determined to create international linkages for all verticals of Superior's educational initiatives by providing opportunities to students and faculty to showcase their work and gain global exposure. 




Chief Guest also awarded 195 Gold Medals to various students who qualified with distinction in their respective programs.
